	It is unusual to be Mayor for two years, so I will be careful not to repeat last year's speech.
	Thank you for putting your faith in me for a second year – it has been an honour and
	privilege to serve you.
	Haverhill is a vibrant community with 100s of volunteers in the town working for others and
	asking nothing in return but doing what they can. We are proud to acknowledge them here
	and offer them what support we can.
	Your Town Council and Councillors work hard to give you a town to be proud of and over
	the course of a year we put on free events to enjoy enjoy events around the town and in
	the town centre, including concerts, the Halloween Trail which gets better and better every
	year, Christmas Lights switch-on including fireworks. The Council runs the Arts Centre
	with a varied and excellent programme, including a beer festival, Live music; something for
	everyone.
	We also have a Civic Life – Commemorations and remembrances, civic services and
	parades. Mr role includes representing Haverhill in supporting other Mayors and towns by

Corn Exchange	Please can we have an update on the Corn Exchange, which the Council were going to try and acquire? It is in a terrible state,
	which is sad as it would have made a good alternative venue.
Mayor	We tried to purchase the building and spent a lot of time and energy trying to acquire it to create a new public venue for Haverhill. Unfortunately we were not able to make headway with the purchase. We tried for 18 months and got nowhere with the vendor and in the end we had to draw a line under the matter. It is a listed building and we have taken up with the Borough Council the need to take action to protect it from further degradation.
Cutting the verges	Who is responsible for cutting the verges?
Mayor	Suffolk County Council Highways are usually the responsible authority, although some verges are also owned by private landowners or the Borough and it is not always obvious who is the responsible party. The frequency of cutting has been reduced by they have just started a round of verge cutting this week
Pot holes	The state of the roads locally, is a concern.
Mayor	The Mayor took the Portfolio Holder for Highways around Haverhill pointing out the problems locally. An additional £21m has been made available to tackle the state of roads, but across the whole of Suffolk this would be spread very thinly.
Shearman Court	Is it possible to have a mirror fitted on the opposite side of Mill Road to improve vision on exit?
Clerk	We will pass this to SCC Highways to ascertain what permission is required to get such mirrors installed.
