MINUTES

1. Apologies for Absence

Apologies for absence had been received from Cllrs Gower, Richardson and Woodward.

2. Declaration of Interests

Cllr Marks declared an interest in item 6 as a member of MAGPAS. Cllr P McManus declared an interest as a member of St Edmundsbury Borough Council. Cllr French declared an interest as a Suffolk County Council member.

3. To confirm Minutes of Meeting held 15th December 2008

The minutes of the meeting held 15th December 2008 were signed as a true record.

4. <u>To deal with any urgent matters arising from the Minutes not covered by this agenda</u>

There were no urgent matters not covered by the agenda.

5. Inspector Andrew Mason, Suffolk Police

Inspector Mason indicated that reported crimes were falling, and that the apprehension and conviction rates were rising, with all perpetrators of recent serious crimes having been arrested and charged.

6. <u>David Monk, General Manager (Cambridgeshire), East of England Ambulance Trust</u>

Mr Monk, and his colleague Neil Storey, gave a presentation on the deployment of ambulances in the Haverhill area. Mr Monk indicated that within the Haverhill "drive zone" there was always an ambulance, plus, previously Monday-Friday peak hours, but currently all week throughout the day and night, a rapid response vehicle. Mr Monk explained that in the event of the Haverhill ambulance being taken off call (i.e. taking a person to

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hospital), an ambulance from a neighbouring "drive zone" would be redeployed.

The meeting was adjourned for the Public Forum

A member of the public complained that the Council meetings were of little interest to the public because it was a rarity to have a full compliment of Councillors, of those Councillors who did attend only two spoke regularly, some Councillors never spoke at the meetings and there was no real open debate. Cllr Byrne indicated that the Council needed to find better ways of communicating with the public. Cllr French felt that members should stand when speaking and that the Mayor should wear the robes and chain at Full Council meetings.

The meeting was reconvened

7. Adoption of Committee Reports

Planning Committee

The Council agreed the adoption of the minutes of the Planning Committee meetings held 6th January 2009.

Community First Committee

The Council reviewed the arrangements for internal audit and agreed they were satisfactory.

The Council review the Council's major risks, and agreed that the combination of measures already in place were adequate.

16. To receive urgent correspondence

The Council considered the need to ensure adequacy of financial advice services in the town to deal with the large-scale redundancies recently announced. It was agreed to hold a special meeting of the Council to which those agencies operating in the town would be invited to make presentation, with a view to determining how the Town Council might support them.

11. Budgets 2009/2010

In view of the decision to hold a special meeting to determine how the Town Council might support advice agencies in the town, it was agreed to defer to that meeting the agreement of the budgets and precept for 2009/2010.

Cllr Carr left the meeting.

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12. To Consider the Adoption of a Statement of Community Engagement

The Council agreed to adopt a Statement of Community Engagement.

13. <u>To Consider the Commemoration of the 20th Anniversary of the Formation of the Town Council</u>

The Council considered the Commemoration of the 20th Anniversary of the formation of the Town Council. It was considered that it would be inappropriate to incur expense of a celebration in the current climate, but agreed that the Council would hold a series of outdoor meetings on the estates to engage with the residents.

14. Correspondence
