# /024 a) D-Day 80 (Thursday, 6<sup>th</sup> June)

- Mayor Smith will host a short service of commemoration at 11am on Market Square.
- Flag raising.
- The Lamp Light of Peace will be lit and held for the flag raising then placed in the church where it will stay for the weekend.
- Revd Max will say a prayer to welcome the Lamp Light of Peace into the church.
- Proclamation written by Pageant Master of D-Day 80, Bruno Peek.
- Act of Remembrance including The Last Post (bugler, eleven-year-old Archie Pannell) on Market Square.
- Ring Out for Peace St Mary's church bells will be rung at 6.30pm.
- It was agreed that the National Anthem should be included.

- There will be flags along the High Street to honour the countries that took part in D Day operations. There will also be banners on the market square to remember local heroes who fought in D-Day. Each banner will include an image of a veteran connected to Haverhill.
- Eleven A1 posters have been created by the Haverhill Family History Group: one for each Haverhill D-Day Veteran. Additionally, five posters with information about D-Day have been created. Discussion arose around where these can be displayed. Revd Max confirmed he is happy for them to be displayed in the church. It was agreed that discussion outside of the meeting will determine where the panels are placed.
- The Town Clerk presented images of the flags for sign-off. It was agreed that designs are fine to go to print. There are not enough lampposts to hold a flag for every country that took part, so a single Commonwealth flag has been created to comprise all the Commonwealth countries.
- A social media campaign is planned to showcase the A1 posters and the event.
- Mayor Smith and Revd Max will liaise to ensure their formal addresses are not duplicated.
- A microphone/amplifier system will be provided.

# b) Suffolk Day (Friday, 21<sup>st</sup> June)
