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HCT To Approve the signing of a new lease for the Haverhill Local History 25/04 Museum,

It was proposed by Councillor J Burns, seconded by Councillor D Smith that the Clerk signs the lease on behalf of the Trust.

HCT Vision 2030

25/05

The Clerk to the Trustee presented proposals for a new Community Trust project on the old Castle Hill Community Middle School. This would see colocation of HTC/HCT services for young people currently located at 1a Boundary Road and a care farm operated by The Befriending Scheme (TBS). As well as the farm, both outside and inside educational facilities, a dedicated youth space, forest school area there would be space for other community organisations and services to share. A kitchen could serve both the farm café and soft-play party kitchen, without the two elements being otherwise connected. An outside play area with features such as a Halo Diamond would make the area attractive for children to visit.

The proposal would transform what is currently a derelict eyesore but well-located site central to Chimswell, Parkway and Clements estates. Capital funding would be sought from grant funders, but with leverage of a potential Public Works Loan paid for from savings realised by operating our services from a highly sustainable, modern site with paying tenants, rather than the Zone which is a compromise site with a high level of obsolete and unreliable factors.

Councillors warmly welcomed the proposals, expressing their excitement for the proposal. It was noted that there needed to be a robust feasibility study leading to a sound business plan. For this HTC/HCT would need to bring in a suitably qualified person to lead the project planning. West Suffolk Councillors Brown, Firman, Hanlon, Miller Jones, D Smith, L Smith and County Councillor J Mason all offered to put some of their respective locality funds towards this project planning.

It was noted that the s106 agreement for the site was to provide for public space, although the site has never been cleared and it seemed unlikely it would be just to become open space. In addition, it was noted that the freehold of the site should be acquired, or an extremely long lease, to satisfy funders' requirements. Furthermore, it was asked that a sequential check for other potential sites be completed as part of the planning, to be sure that the best available site is used.

It was proposed by Councillor J Mason, seconded by Councillor M Martin that the Trust recommends to Haverhill Town Council that this proposal be further developed to create a feasibility study and business plan.
